This certificate accompanies a 2001 Australian Kookaburra 1oz uncirculated silver coin, minted and inspected by The Perth Mint, Western Australia.

The coin bears a special gold insert privy mark of a seven-pointed star to represent the Federation of Australian States and Territories in 1901. Prior to that date, the States were independent British colonies, each with their own laws. In order for Federation to be achieved, all States were required to surrender some of their powers to allow the formation of a new Commonwealth Government.

The host coin design depicts two kookaburras, perched back to back on a eucalyptus branch. The reverse features the Ian Rank-Broadley effigy of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.

Australian Kookaburra coins are made from 99.9% pure silver, and are legal tender under the Australian Currency Regulations Act.

Mintage is limited to 9,000 individual privy marked coins.
